This fund is suited to investors seeking a conservatively managed balanced fund with stable inflation beating returns.

Investment objectives and strategy

The Ashburton Targeted Return Fund is a cautious, low equity fund. Its primary objective is to beat South African Consumer Price Inflation (CPI) + 3,5% over a rolling 3 year period. The fund utilises asset allocation, currency diversification, credit inclusion, duration variation and derivative strategies in order source additional returns for the fund. The goal is to provide a single solution for the low risk component of a portfolio or the destination for the conservative investor looking for the higher returns that can be obtained when a wide array of asset classes are available. The fund will aim to achieve performance returns in excess of its benchmark and will comply with regulations governing retirement funds. 
